#### SPECIAL INTEREST GROUPS

We have a number of special interest groups; detailed information on all groups is available on the EPS Website. Members are welcome to attend all of them.

**Nature Group:** Meets monthly on Tuesdays. This is an active and well supported group with broad levels of expertise and interests covering a wide range of Nature topics. We have both internal and external speakers, organise outings and have a monthly digital image challenge. The best set of three images on any aspect of Nature is awarded the *An Iolaire* Cup and is judged by an external judge. Group members provide help and advice to newcomers.

#### SPECIAL INTEREST GROUPS

Phoenix Group: Usually meets last Thursday of each month. It is an informal discussion forum for members keen to develop their photography by creating a body of photographic work, entering external competitions to represent the Society, submitting work into photographic salons or achieving a photographic distinction. Members bring along their photography work, give a brief statement of their aims and display work for comment. There will be members present who can offer an opinion based on their extensive personal experience. There is no membership criteria, but it is not a beginners' group, so does not give instruction in basic photographic techniques or equipment.

Studio and Portrait Group (Beginners): Beginners-only sessions are planned for those new to studio photography. Dates and topics will be announced by email. These sessions will have a theory component and an element of fun practical photography in the studio, so remember to bring your camera and separate portable speedlite flashgun if you have one. The practical component will involve photographing still life objects including the studio mannequin. There are no plans to invite models to the majority of these events.

### HOW CAN EPS HELP YOU WITH YOUR PHOTOGRAPHIC PROJECT?

The process of carrying out a photographic project is a great way to develop your photography and take it to a higher level. It means that you are photographing with a great deal of intent and have a plan to follow. It will improve your artistic and technical skills as well as result in a 'tangible' artefact.

The EPS syllabus is filled with opportunities to learn about a whole range of photographic topics. There may be some lectures which directly address your interest, however there will be several other opportunities through the session which can help you with your project.

There are one-off sessions held to give guidance on printing, presentation and mounting of photographs and the following two groups may provide additional opportunities.

#### The Photo Book Group

If your project involves publishing a book, then meetings of the **Photo Book Group** are essential to attend. Here you will meet members with a wide range of experience - from people who are thinking about making their first book to others who have successfully published and sold books.

It is run as an informal group of members who have an interest in making and enjoying photobooks. The topics discussed include image selection and ordering, book design and layout, as well as publishing and selling.

This group meets approximately once a month on Tuesday or Thursday.

### HOW CAN EPS HELP YOU WITH YOUR PHOTOGRAPHIC PROJECT?

#### The Phoenix Group

Supporting members carrying out a photographic project to produce a body of work is one of the objectives of the Phoenix Group.



This group meets on the last Thursday of the month.


#### Help from other members



The Edinburgh International is one of the oldest exhibitions of photography in the world. This prestigious exhibition was first held in 1861. Entry is open to all, world-wide. Only prints are accepted and the exhibition of selected prints is open to the public as part of the Edinburgh Festival Fringe, when our premises become Venue 130. Unless able to influence scoring, EPS Members may enter and compete for the exclusive Edinburgh Medal.

Members' help is essential for unpacking, labelling, setting-up, hanging, cataloguing, and door-staffing at the Exhibition. Members also assist the invited panel of judges by running the logistics on two judging days.

Helpers see some great images close-up including those that don't quite make the final (around 160) prints selected from the thousands submitted.
